He was awarded Life Membership in 1986. His funeral was held on Tuesday 14th July at Star of the Sea Catholic Church, Miranda. A burial at Woronora Cemetery took place afterwards.

\* We wish to remind members that plants are not to be removed from the benching tables prior to the end of the meeting for security reasons as well as it is discourteous to our speakers. If you need to remove them before this, please speak to Frank or a committee member about it.

\* At our meetings, the judges are required to constantly move plants between classes as members place their plants in the wrong class. If members are unsure which class your plant belongs in, they are asked to check with a judge. Plastic guides with measurements will be placed on the benching table to measure your flowers against. Judges also have a calliper on hand which members can borrow to check the measurement of their flowers.

### LIFE MEMBER- MR RAY HARMAN

This year our Show Schedules have been emailed/mailed to all members. If by chance you have not received a copy particularly if you usually receive your Bulletin by email, please contact Jan Robinson who has a PDF format of the Schedule.

Please carefully read over the information. Any member wishing to put on a Table Top display, please ring our Show Marshal Bob Moar 24 hours before set-up. (Ph. 9524 9377 Please speak to Bob personally).

**Your help is needed on Wednesday from 1pm** to assist Bob in setting up the tables, lighting and the fixing of the wind break on the side of the display area.

Plants will be received from **4pm to 6.30pm** on Wednesday.

Please take home from the August meeting the buff coloured Registration cards and the Show Entry Form and fill them out before coming to the show. These 2 items can be found at the back of the hall along with the Show Roster.

**SHOW ROSTER: At the last Spring Show the committee trialled a new form of volunteer roster. We are asking members to once again volunteer for particular jobs. This way we know that all jobs and time allocations will be covered beforehand.**

Once again we are asking for large plants for our **potting demonstrations**. It would be greatly appreciated if any member has one or a number of them and wishes to donate or sell them, please contact me. Large plants are getting harder and harder to find. We have 3 potting demonstrations, 2 on Saturday -11am and 2pm and 1 on Sunday -11am. Not only do our sponsors, Swanes Nursery appreciate our demonstrations, but also our visitors see first hand how to break up and re-pot an orchid. 3 Members needed for potting demonstrations. Please see roster.

As always, members can sell their excess well grown orchid plants on the **Sales Table**. Please remember 2 tags, healthy and pest free plants, a 15% society commission applies. Plants not in flower have a greater chance of selling if a photo of the flower is attached.

Changes to the Sales Bench criteria were made last year. A copy will be at the back of the hall at the June meeting or refer to the 2014 October's Bulletin.

**Exhibited plants can now be sold.** A small 'For Sale' society buff card will be placed at the base of the orchid plant for sale. The owner is responsible for filling out the 'for sale information sheet' held behind the sales table. Plants are not to be removed from exhibition until after 3pm on Sunday.

Please remember not to park in Swane's carpark (including the top car park). Please park to the south of the nursery or in a nearby street as the carpark is for Swane's Nursery customers.

**This is very important.** It is OK to drop a few orchids but then quickly move your car.

## ***An International Orchid Speaker in Sydney***

Roy Tokunaga from H&R Orchids in Hawaii is the guest speaker for both the SPECIES meeting on Wednesday 12th August 2015 and at the Kuringai Orchid Society meeting on Monday 17th. Roy is world renown and will be bringing some flasks out for the St Ives Orchid Fair and while he is here he will give talks at just these two Societies.

At Species, on the Wednesday night before St Ives (the 12th), his talk will focus on Orchid Culture. Roy has been collecting information from some of the world's best growers and has found a number of things they have in common. Also, using studies like the "Nutrition of Higher Plants", he has searched for those elusive flower boosters, looking for the perfectly grown specimens. Some of the species featured will be *Dendrochilum filiforme*, *Dyakia hendersoniana*, *Den anosmum*, *Den spectabile*, and *Grammatophyllum scriptum*. Species meet at the West Pennant Hill Community Church, 41-43 Eaton Road West Pennant Hills – (hall and sales table open 7pm, meeting commences 8pm) Roy should have flasks for sale at the SPECIES meeting prior to St Ives.

At Kuringai's meeting on the Monday after St Ives (the 17th) Roy's topic will be "The Genus *Dendrobium*". This will focus on some of the most commonly grown species and hybrids from 10 different sections of the genus, including section *Latourea*, which has been the subject of much work by Australia's own Phil Spence and Kevin McFarlane. Lots of pictures and general culture information. Kuringai meet at the Lindfield Community Centre, corner of Bradfield Rd and Moore Ave, West Lindfield – (hall & sales table open 7pm, meeting starts 8pm.)

This is a great opportunity to see and hear the great international speaker on different topics at both SPECIES and Kuringai, and to enjoy the meeting company of these societies. Everyone is welcome.

# ORCHID AUCTION

Due to ill health Neville Roper is auctioning his entire collection of species and hybrids of his Sarcocochilus, Dendrobium and Dockrillia orchid collection.

This collection is the culmination of over 30 years of acquiring and breeding superior clones of many genera. Neville's achievements include 116 prestigious awards and the naming of 128 Sarcocochilus seedlings, as well as many others for Dendrobium and Dockrillia Orchids. His seedlings are much sought after both within Australia and overseas for their quality, colour and pattern variations and they have been prolific class and championship winners at many shows.

While some seedlings and lesser known plants have already been sold to reduce the bulk of the plants to be auctioned NONE of the superior show bench/stud/ awarded plants has left the collection and will be auctioned on the day. Seedlings and lesser/miscellaneous plants will be auctioned in tray lots.

**Date/Time:** Sunday, 23 August, 2015 at 10 am until finished. Viewing from 9.30 am.

**Venue:** 36 Streamside Street, Woollamia (near Huskisson).

There are many other significant plants including many yellow Sarcs, selectively bred hartmannii seedlings, flowering and near flowering size speciosums (all nursery bred using top parents) and native hybrids plus many Dockrillias of all sizes.

Seedlings and others will be auctioned in tray lots, mostly to save time, for example 100mm Sarcs will be in trays of 20 plants, 125 mm Sarcs in trays of 9 or 12 plants



smell this flower.

I bought this orchid from Classic Orchids at Wyong in the 1990's.

It's a hardy grower that has resisted my killer instincts.

I have grown this orchid in full sun, as you can see from the sunburn leaf, to dappled light under a tree.

The problem with the plant is that it is very difficult to transport to the show bench, you need a car with a sun roof!

The Britannica's Pocket Orchid reports that some inflorescences have been as long as 4 metres, which makes mine puny to say the least.

### *Schomburgkia superbiens.*

One photo is of the flowers which are pink and yellow (and I had to stand on a step ladder to photograph) and the second is of the plant itself.

The inflorescence of this plant is 1.9 metres tall.

In fact, from the tip of the flower to the bottom of the plant is 2.4 metres.

This orchid occurs in Mexico, Honduras and Guatemala and the Britannica's Pocket Orchid describes the flowers as long lasting and fragrant although I haven't been up to



## You Grew It

### **Dendrochilum javieriense** Exhibited by S.T.Ho

Javier's dendrochilum named after an orchid nursery proprietor from the Philippines. The species was named in honour of the late Elias Javier and the correct name is '**Dendrochilum javierii**' (as per Jim Cootes).

This stunning species is endemic to the Island of Luzon in the Philippines and grows in the mountains as an epiphyte, found on tree branches in 10 – 30% sunlight at altitudes above 1200m. It can tolerate a wide range of temperatures as a cool grower and grows at temperatures of 12 – 35 degrees celsius in the wild.

Having cylindrical, tubelike leaves that can be up to 20 - 25cm long with tapered pseudobulbs, the arching inflorescence arise from new growth

Flowers are about 12mm across and have widely spreading sepals and petals. The labellum is "porrect" (directed forward and downwards) and is 3 lobed. Now the brilliance of the flowers, the colour which ranges from yellow to bright yellowish green and looks stunning mixed in the green foliage.

Propagation is easy through division and a specimen plant is quickly grown as this is an easy grower, probably requiring a little more light than most Dendrochilums. This species is commonly sold as D. Wenzellii.

Dendrochilums are an easy orchid for new and old growers. Most are cool growing and grow easy in Sutherland Shire climate in a green house. They grow in most mediums and multiple quickly. I am at present having success having them in water well pots but they grow well in black plastic and tree fern pots. They flower of new growth and give a splendid display of arching flowers, take up little room, and get few pest problems. Although many varieties look like grass the tiny flowers give a great display and there are numerous varieties, with a kaleidoscope of colours among genera.



### **Dendrobium tetragonum var. giganteum** Exhibited by R. Jackson



This amazing Australian species ranges from Illawarra district on the South Coast of NSW to S.E. Queensland. Named from the Greek tetragonal meaning four angles which is a cross section of the shape of the semi pendulous pseudobulbs.

Described as an epiphyte hanging loosely from small trees in dry shaded woods with host trees mostly being Paper barks, Meloleuca, Casuarina and water gums along the coastal strip. It prefers to follow water courses seldom above 400m. They grow in heavy shade with high humidity and good air movement.

Canes can be 60cm in length, hanging down vertically with a few leaves at the ends of the canes. The inflorescence appear at the ends of the canes and can rebloom over several flowering periods, so do not remove the old inflorescence. The blooms are "spider" like in shape, hence the common name of Spider Orchid, they range in colour from cream to yellow green and can have some very distinctive reddish markings.



They do not like to be disturbed. If grown on slabs or wood mounts they should be firmly attached and left alone. If grown in pots use a very coarse mix as the plants have a fine root system and like to dry out quickly. Plants multiply by making aerial growths from the canes. They like a dryer winter.

Another orchid that takes up little room and hangs from the top of your shade house. Requires little attention, just watch for Dendrobium Beetle if outside. The rewards of these beautiful spidery flowers around Spring will make it worth adding to your collection.

## Masdevallia delphina Exhibited by Tony Costa and Sandra Crosby



The 'dolphin - like' masdevallia form the shape of the flowers.

This miniature epiphyte is found growing on the slopes of Equadorian Andes at altitudes of 1600 - 2200 meters. The inflorescence carries a number of successive opening flowers and is one of a few masdevallia that carry more than a single flower per inflorescence.

Masdevallia are generally epiphytes found in cool, moist areas. In Tasmania some growers have them in their gardens and grow like weeds (lucky people). They are generally difficult to grow in Sydney's climate and most growers steer clear of these very attractive orchids that come in a marinade of colours, usually with a "kite like" shape. The sepals unite at the base, forming short or

long tails. They usually have small narrow petals. They require good light to flower but beware of those hot Summer days which can be fatal. In saying all this a past member, Dennis Wood grew his Massies hanging from the underside of his benches in his shade house.
