**Our 63rd Winter Show will be held at Swane's Nursery, Sylvania from Thursday 18th June to Sunday 21st June, setting up on Wednesday 17th June at 1pm.**

This year our Show Schedules have been emailed/mailed to all members. If by chance you have not received a copy particularly if you usually receive your Bulletin by email, please contact Jan Robinson who has a PDF format of the Schedule.

Please carefully read over the information. Any member wishing to put on a Table Top display, please ring our Show Marshal Bob Moar 24 hours before set-up. (Ph. 9524 9377 Please speak to Bob personally).

**Your help is needed on Wednesday from 1pm** to assist Bob in setting up the tables, lighting and the fixing of the wind break on the side of the display area.

Plants will be received from **4pm to 6.30pm** on Wednesday.

Please take home from the June meeting the yellow Registration cards and the Show Entry Form and fill them out before coming to the show. These 2 items can be found at the back of the hall along with the Show Roster.

**SHOW ROSTER: At the last Spring Show the committee trialed a new form of volunteer roster. We are asking members to once again volunteer for particular jobs. This way we know that all jobs and time allocations will be covered beforehand.**

Once again we are asking for large plants for our **potting demonstrations**. It would be greatly appreciated if any member has one or a number of them and wishes to donate or sell them, please contact me. Large plants are getting harder and harder to find. We have 3 potting demonstrations, 2 on Saturday -11am and 2pm and 1 on Sunday -11am. Not only do our sponsors, Swanes Nursery appreciate our demonstrations, but also our visitors see first hand how to break up and re-pot an orchid. 3 Members needed for potting demonstrations. Please see roster.

As always, members can sell their excess well grown orchid plants on the **Sales Table**. Please remember 2 tags, healthy and pest free plants, a 15% society commission applies. Plants not in flower have a greater chance of selling if a photo of the flower is attached.

Changes to the Sales Bench criteria were made last year. A copy will be at the back of the hall at the June meeting or refer to the 2014 October's Bulletin.

**Exhibited plants can now be sold.** A small 'For Sale' society buff card will be placed at the base of the orchid plant for sale. The owner is responsible for filling out the 'for sale information sheet' held behind the sales table. Plants are not to be removed from exhibition until after 3pm on Sunday.

Please remember not to park in Swane's carpark (including the top car park). Please park to the south of the nursery or in a nearby street as the carpark is for Swane's Nursery customers.

**This is very important.** It is OK to drop a few orchids but then quickly move your car.

## **Coelogyne fimbriata** - 2 forms benched, G.Hodder & M.Chappell

The "fringed Coelogyne", from the shape of the lip.

This species is found throughout the Asian area at elevations from sea level to 1500m. Having ovoid (egg shaped) pseudobulbs that have two leaves where blooms arise from newest mature bulbs that produce 1 -3 fragrant (musk) long lasting small flowers.

This rambling, easy to grow, successively flowering orchid is very popular for everybody from beginners to old hands. This orchid can be mounted it is very well suited to a hanging basket with a well draining mix, this allows for a spectacular showing of the flowers. You will find that it seems to quickly out grow it's basket due to the rambling growth pattern. You will soon see aerial roots and runners, no need to rush out and re pot, it will keep growing in this manner for several years. As with plants with lots of aerial roots it will need high humidity to stay healthy.

Tonight there were two varieties benched, similar plants, different lip colouring. Collecting different variations can become a challenge or obsession on it's own with this easy to grow orchid.



## **Dendrochilum Wenzelii** "Plant of the Night" exhibited by S.T.Ho



From the Philippines this beautiful species epiphyte orchid grows around and over 1000m in warm areas with partial shade and bright light.

Looking like grass the clustered pseudobulbs have terete – fusiform (cylindrical or tubelike, spindle shape) leathery leaves up to 30cm long and 5cm wide. Flowering appears on new growth and last about 3 weeks and appear during Winter. Inflorescence are semi arching and will carry up to and sometimes beyond 30 flowers. The flowers are most commonly bright red but are extremely variable from dull red (rust), brown, orange to greenish - yellow. Collecting various colour forms can give a great display.

This plant with the right conditions will nearly double in size each year and will quickly grow to a specimen size plant. It may "sulk" if it's roots are disturbed. Grow in the shade house and it can take a variety of extremes with night temperatures to 4 deg.C and 70% shade. They like plenty of water and can even be grown in a tray of water year round.

The plant benched tonight is a piece of an awarded plant that has exceptional colour and has the flower spike or inflorescence held above the foliage to give a great display. Keep an eye out for this form on the sales bench, worth obtaining for your collection.

## **Laelia Anceps** exhibited by Jan Robinson



A brilliant species found on rocks and pine forests in Mexico and Honduras at altitudes of 500m to 1500m. It is a medium sized warm to cool growing epiphyte often found in full sun in the wild.

The plant has angular, ribbed pseudobulbs that are about 10cm in length which have 1 or 2 leathery leaves from which a 60 – 120 cm inflorescence will emerge that will carry 2 -6 long lasting, scented clumping flowers that are from 6 – 12 cms.

These fantastic flowers are generally a pale lavender with an intense crimson lip that has a yellow / red striped centre. There are many other varieties and each as stunning. The "alba " form has white sepals and petals with a white lip and yellow in the centre. The variety 'vietchiana" has again white sepals and petals but the

lip is purple. The colour variations in this genus is wide and varied.

An ideal orchid for beginners as it is easy to grow and flowers regularly, does well outdoors. It will withstand extremes in temperature from 2 deg. to 36 deg. Likes good air movement, good light plenty of water in summer and a drier winter, does well mounted. A large plant of Anceps with numerous inflorescence gives a spectacular display. If you don't have room for one in your green house, tie a piece to a tree in the yard. You will be rewarded with a long spray of brilliant lilac flowers nodding in the breeze. A definite for all beginners, to find a spot in your collection and then chase up other varieties for colour variations.
