THE 2014 AUCTION TRIFECTA!!!

The first horse out of the blocks in the **2014 SSOS Trifecta** was the Holsted auction on 14th of April at our monthly general meeting. Earlier that day, the Committee had gathered at the Penshurst home of the late Allan and Nell Holsted (who had both sadly passed away late last year) to transport the orchids to our meeting hall. The neighbours had been taking good care of the Holsted's orchid collection and were happy to help load the plants into our vehicles. Although someone had said there were "about 200" plants to pick up, we packed Bob Moar's van to the hilt and our four 4WD's were chocker block and still we had to leave lots of plants behind! After a short trip back to the church, we unloaded all the plants (luckily there were parking spots available close to the door!) and put them at the front of the church hall in preparation of the auction. Many of the orchids were in spike, we tried our best not to damage them in transit.

After the shortest business meeting in Society history--conducted by our new President Frank Daniel (keep up the good work, Frank!!)--the auction commenced with Murray as auctioneer. Over the next several hours, with only a short tea break, over 300 plants found new homes. The majority of the Holsted collection was exhibition-style cattleyas, but there were plenty of other genera on offer to interest the punters. Richard Dimon and Bob Nichol were kept busy collecting the money and handing over the plants to the new owners. As soon as a plant was sold, Bob Moar or Louise Gannon handed Murray another plant to auction. Murray did a fantastic job and worked up quite the lather describing all those plants and keeping the auction moving.

The second horse out of the blocks in the **Trifecta** was the auction of Kevin "Grouchy" Wilson's collection on the day after Anzac Day. Kevin is moving up north and is able to take only a few orchids with him, so the rest of his plants have to be sold. People started to arrive at Grouchy's place early in the afternoon to look at the orchids and have a chat. At 2:00 the whistle blew and Neville and Murray took turns describing plants or the contents of boxes of plants to the punters. Mike Hitchcock and Bob Nichol were the bag men, trying to keep up with who bought which plant for how much \$. Many of the plants were Kevin's own breeding, particularly sarcs and paphs. It didn't take long for over 750 plants to exchange hands. We will miss Kevin's friendly face and kind words of advice at our meetings and shows, and wish him all the best in his new home--which just happens to have a perfect place for growing slipper orchids, complete with a watering system already installed!

The final part of the **Trifecta** will be the Society's annual auction at our next general meeting on 12th of May. Each member can bring up to **six** entries for the auction, an "entry" can be a single plant or a box of plants. If you wish to set a reserve price for your entry, make sure you get a coloured dot to put on your plant before the auction starts. I'm sure that Murray would greatly appreciate it if anyone would like to help out as an auctioneer! (Don't forget that there will be **NO SALES BENCH** at the May meeting.)

If you haven't spent all your money betting on the Trifecta, there is always Orchids Out West which opens on Friday the 16th of May.....

You Grew It

Paphiopedilum spicerianum **Rossioglossum grande** exhibited by

exhibited by S.T.Ho

Named in honour of grower Herbert Spicer of Surrey, England in 1878

This species is native to India and areas near by. It is found on steep rocky slopes or rock crevasses, growing in thick moss where the area is subject to heavy fog and drizzle. Found at elevations of 300 – 2000 metres it is cool to warm growing. This orchid flowers in Autumn till Winter, needs shade and no rest period in Winter.

Flower size is 6 – 8 cm on a 20 – 40cm inflorescence, olive green petals with a broad dorsal sepal that is hooded, that in the wild prevents water from entering the pouch, which is white with a green base and with a narrow, central, purple stripe and a bronze pouch. This orchid has been used extensively in breeding.

Common names include "clown orchid" and "tiger orchid".

This species is found in Mexico and Guatemala. Growing at elevations of 1400 – 2700m found in moist deciduous rainforests, resulting in warm to cool humid conditions.

The plant has flattened pseudobulbs with up to three broad leathery leaves at the apex with a 30cm long stiff racemose (an inflorescence that has flowers that are set in a zig zag from side to side arrangement) carrying up to eight extremely showy, waxy, long lasting, yellow flowers barred with red.

Cultivation conditions, bright light, warm, humid during growing period from late Spring to Autumn, keep on the dry side during Winter and only water to keep pseudobulbs from shrivelling.

Propagation is by division. The species in this genus do not hybridise or cross with the species of any other genus.

Species found in Malaysia, Borneo, Java and Sumatra growing at elevations of 700 – 2000m as a cool to warm grower.

Plants grow a cluster of pseudobulbs with 1 – 2 leaves (20 – 30cm long) and blooms can be either short or quite long (up to 30cm) inflorescence. The sequential (one at a time) flowers can bloom at anytime during the year, arise from the centre of the pseudobulb and can each last several weeks.

Flowers have a musky scent with almost white sepals through to darkish green and yellow green and the lip colour also varies enormously from dark browns to shades of red.

The flowers are huge (7 – 8cm) and spectacular, it is an attractive, tough, hardy easy to grow orchid, popular with both novice and experienced growers. I have this orchid growing in a teak basket pot with a well drained mix hanging in my shade house in Sutherland Shire.

Coelogyne rochussenii

exhibited by Murray Aldridge

Willem de Vriese named this species in 1854, in honour of Mr. Rochussen, the then Minister of the Colonies of the Dutch East Indies.

Found in Philippines, Sumatra, Java, Borneo and Malaysia as a species orchid found as an epiphyte (orchids that occur on trees but not parasitic) often overhanging rivers at elevations up to 1500m so this orchid requires warm to hot growing conditions.

This orchid when grown into a specimen plant can look spectacular with a pendulous curtain of flower spikes cascading around the pot or basket carrying 40+ lemon scented flowers on inflorescences that can measure a metre in length. Flowers semi close each night and reopen with the morning sun.

Coelogyne rochussenii requires a warm glass house in Sydney (anywhere outside of the tropics) with year round watering. All orchids that require heavy watering should be in shallow, well drained pots / baskets so the roots do not become water logged and rot.
